We have an 'open door' access to this department and any comments, both good and bad, which you provide to me or any member of the committee will be relayed through that door.

I have indicated at one of our monthly meetings that the Barnsley Clinical Commissioning Group has given us notice that after the payment for 2014/2015 funding for the exercise class will be withdrawn as 'an economy measure'.

We have registered an immediate appeal against this decision which, we have been informed, has been put into 'the system'.
