REVIEW of 2024

The headline comment in this year's report must be some well-deserved praise for two of our founder members, who have spent over 20 years associated with the branch and are still active. Through their achievements they have raised the profile of the branch and the Parkinson's 'family'. George Spencer attended a Buckingham Palace Garden party in recognition of his services and Philip Thompson completed his 100th Parkrun at the age of 89.

2024 saw continued success for the Barnsley branch, expanding our activities and more of our members participating in events.

Continuing our campaign to highlight the importance of time-critical medication for people with Parkinson's who attend or are admitted to hospital, we worked closely with Barnsley Hospital and Parkinson's UK Campaign Team. This has led to the roll-out of a series of initiatives across the hospital to raise awareness and improve the administration of time- critical medication across all hospital departments.

Financial

Our financial position remains strong, in large part due to the generous donations we have received during the year and the continued support from the Community Lottery, Shawlands Trust and South Yorkshire Community Foundation. The cash pooling scheme continues to prove beneficial. Since joining the Parkinson's UK scheme, we have introduced online banking which has provided us with improved audit trail of our finances.

Fundraising

There have been several fundraising events during the year. These included one supermarket collection and one at Barnsley Football club. We have also raised funds at two events at Locke Park - the classic car event and the gala; and the Penistone Agricultural Show. We received £600 from an anonymous donor who wished the money to be used towards the cost of our Carers' Pamper Day. Three Barnsley companies - Euroglaze, Tarn End Tap and Brook Financial Services - made significant

donations. Our "Just Giving" page on the website continues to be an added source of income. £3009 was raised during 2024. (£1000 of that was from an anonymous donor in the name of Susan Grant). Donations were also gratefully received from The Cottage Bakery, Silkstone; The Darton Bakery, Friendly Masonic Lodge, Barnsley Inner Wheel and Archbishop Holgate Hospital Trust. We are also deeply indebted to those who have lost loved ones in 2024 and have arranged for donations to be made to the branch in lieu of flowers. To all the other organisations and individuals not mentioned who have raised money for us, we offer our sincere and grateful thanks.

Services

In terms of service provision, all the branch's core services have been maintained during 2024 - the exercise class, respite care, Natter Café, counselling service, summer walks and visits. Also the annual Carers' Pamper Day provided relaxation and a choice of spa treatments for our hard working carers.

This year we have extended our programme by introducing monthly golf driving and weekly non-contact boxing. I am pleased to report that all our activities have been extremely well-attended.

The Facebook page (Parkinson's Barnsley) which we set up last year to promote the branch and provide regular updates about our activities and events has proved very successful as a means of keeping our members and followers up to date with our programme of events.

During the year we mourned the loss of Mary Beevers, Peter Greenhoff, Glenda Rogers, Derek Rogers, Joyce Blundell and Melvin Wragg.

We welcomed Nishadi Perera to the committee as our new Assistant Treasurer. In addition to her role as Meeter & Greeter at branch meetings, Maxine Mellor has taken responsibility for producing our quarterly newsletter.

Grateful thanks go to Carolyn Turton, Parkinson's Clinical Specialist Nurse, for her continued support of all those in Barnsley with Parkinson's or affected by Parkinson's. We are also indebted to Rose Crawley, Parkinson's UK Local Volunteer Officer, for her help and guidance.

My personal thanks go to all my fellow committee members who have supported me in delivering a very lively and active programme for our members.

November


The annual Carers' Pamper Day was held at Bannatynes Spa. There was a second visit to the Metrodome for ten-pin bowling followed by lunch.
